

Greetings, friends of HPCA! Welcome to a new and exciting school year in North Philadelphia. We have started the year strong. All of our teachers are returning faculty members and we have waiting lists for most of our classes. Praise God!

Our school-wide theme this year is "Love Your Neighbor." Lately, I've been thinking about God's love for us and our neighbors and seeing that the Lord has been generous even in tough times. In a season where some fellow Christian schools have regrettably been forced to close, HPCA's doors are still

open. God is at work here, and I want to thank you for playing a vital role. Your gifts and your prayers make you co-laborers with us in our mission to reach the children and families of Philadelphia.

At HPCA, we want to love our students by providing for their needs holistically. The Lord has blessed us to build the program we have today to effectively love our students. We have Foundations and Frameworks, a strong reading program that fosters a love for reading, Responsive Classroom, our social curriculum and classroom management model, MAP testing, a computer-based standardized testing that students take three times per year and that gives immediate feedback, and more. This year we have added the Student Government Association, and these middle-schoolers are already hard at work planning great things for this school year, such as field day, harvest day, and a food drive. We know that the Lord has blessed us in order to bless our students, providing opportunity for greater proficiency in reading and math, improved social skills, leadership opportunities, and deeper understanding of Scripture.

We are thankful, too, that you are loving your neighbor by partnering with HPCA. You have made a difference in the lives of hundreds of children and families. I want to encourage you to keep up this neighborly love. In order for our mission and work to continue, we need you. To keep our school affordable, tuition is kept low and only covers about 50% of our total operating expenses. This year, we need to raise nearly \$190,000 for these expenses. Scholarship Need

Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) Program


...A Great Way for Businesses to Direct Tax Dollars



The EITC program is a way for the business community to get directly involved in education by providing scholarship money. The program enables companies in Pennsylvania to support local non-profits, like **HPCA**, at minimal cost, instead of sending their tax dollars to Harrisburg.

Companies can claim the credit against

- Corporate Net Income Tax
- Bank and Trust Company Shares Tax
- Title Insurance Companies Shares Tax
- Mutual Thrift Institutions Tax
- Insurance Premiums Tax
- Capital Stock and Franchise Tax




Businesses receive a tax credit of 90% if the they donate money toward a scholarship fund for HPCA students for 2 years (75% tax credit if it is one year).


Results are in...

The following graphs compare proficiency levels in math and reading for middle school students in HPCA and in public schools in the 19140 and 19124 zip codes, where the majority of our students reside. Students at HPCA take the NWEA MAP test, which has been converted below to reflect the PA levels of proficiency.
