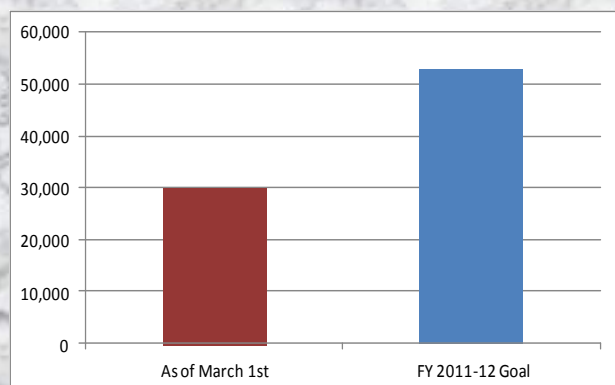
1st grade student Xavier was one of many students to receive an award for diligent work in the classroom.
