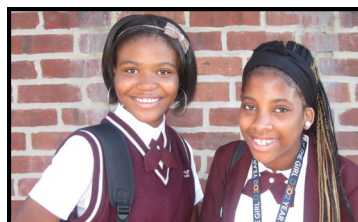


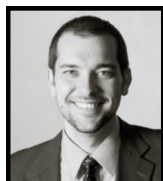

## STANDING FIRM

*I remain confident of this: I will see the goodness of the LORD in the land of the living. Wait for the LORD; be strong and take heart and wait for the LORD.*

- Psalm 27: 13-14

A student and his father walked into my office in mid-July this past summer, inquiring about re-enrollment. The family had moved the student to a new school after the end of the 2011-2012 school year. I asked them what sparked their desire to come back, and the father said that his son had repeatedly asked to return. When I asked the student what made HPCA so different and special, he quickly gave me two reasons. First, he could learn without worrying about fights or constant classroom disruptions and with his second reason he humbled me and made me proud of our students and faculty. **He said that he is free to be himself at HPCA. He said, "I can just be me."** What a testimony of hope!

The father testified that the student asked often, even daily at points, to return. This student stood firm in his desire. (And, yes, he is enrolled in HPCA and doing well.) Our school theme this year, coincidentally, is "Standing Firm." The staff and students of HPCA are examining and practicing what standing firm on God really means. We have asked, *What is at the bottom of everything?* When you dig, get rid of the mess, the stuff, the clutter, the good works, when you get to the bottom, what is left? As with everything in life, it all begins with God our Rock and the foundation of His Word. As a school community, we are choosing to stand and build on His foundation.

**This year marks HPCA's 15<sup>th</sup> year! Praise God for keeping us and growing us!** We are so thankful that students have been able to find hope and a strong learning community. And we are thankful to you, for bearing the burden of educational justice along with us. As we build on a sure foundation in this, our 15<sup>th</sup> year, I am reminded of the encouraging imperative from Psalm 27 (*above*). It is only in the Lord that standing and building happen simultaneously with waiting. I invite you to wait on the Lord with us, to stand firm on God's foundation with us, and to build with us this year.

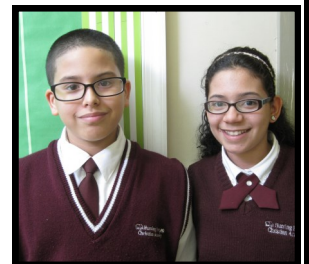
