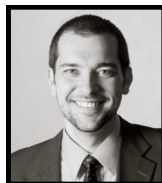

"RISE"-ing Hope

"but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint." - Isaiah 40:31



Greetings, Friends of HPCA. As we wind down our 17th year at HPCA, our theme, RISE, is still as potent and energizing as it was when I wrote about it in September. We expect our HPCA students to RISE - Respond to the Gospel, Ignite the Community for Change, Serve God and Others, and Excel in Academics and Life - and we remain **hopeful** that we will see the fruit in each student's life.

Rising, by its very definition and nature, is a challenging undertaking. It involves struggling upward against multiple obstacles - deception, injustice, peer pressure, trauma, and gravity. We have asked our students to do a difficult thing. Knowing the struggles that some of our students are facing, some might say that rising is nearly impossible. **Hopeless.**

The final memory verse of the year is Isaiah 40:31. This beautiful section is sandwiched between chapters telling of Assyrian invasions and the Babylonian exile. The Israelites were hurting, hard-pressed, and struck down. "Rising" wasn't exactly going to be easy. How could they possibly be restored? How could they rise again to former freedom and status? Some may have said it was nearly impossible. **Hopeless.**

But we see here in verse 31 that there is, in fact, **hope**, and it has everything to do with the work of the Lord and our response to Him. Those who **hope** in the Lord (or, wait upon, eagerly look for, and expect the Lord) will renew their strength. Even though they are down-trodden, they will soar on wings like eagles. They will rise. This is the heartbeat of the **hope** we have for our students, as well as ourselves - waiting expectantly on a God who "gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak." (v. 29)

I have seen it! I am here to bear witness: I have seen students, by the grace and power of Jesus, RISE! God is at work in the lives of our students and their families - it is real and tangible. It is precisely because of the nature and work of our Lord that I remain **hopeful**, expectantly waiting, watching to see what God has in store for our children. I welcome you to partner with us as God continues to work here in Hunting Park. I encourage you to become co-witnesses with us as we watch the God of Israel impact the lives of students and families of Hunting Park with **hope**. I invite you to see them RISE. Thank you for your help and partnership this year. God bless.
