Principal

Very truly I tell you, whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. - John 14:12

What would you do if Jesus left? Have you ever thought about how you might process that event, if, after years of leading and teaching, He just...moved on? At the Last Supper, after speaking many times about His death and the apostles' betrayal and denial, Jesus told the

apostles that He was going to the Father to prepare a place for them—a destination. He then told them, "You know the way to the place where I am going."

With understandable confusion, one of the apostles asked, "How can we know the way if we don't know where You are going?" He was longing for Jesus to give him direction and guidance. Jesus responded by saying, "I am the way." He did not say, "I know the way," or, "I can show you the way." He declared that He is the Way. Another apostle then said, "Show us the Father and that will be enough." He was longing to know the destination, the end. Jesus' response was, "Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father."

When we experience difficult struggles or daunting tasks, we often call out to God in the same way the apostles did. We worry about the destination, the end to whatever trouble we are facing. Have you ever felt yourself thinking, "If I could just see and know how it all turns out, I would finally have some peace"? It is not only the destination; we also worry about the way itself. We wonder if we are going the correct direction, at the right speed, with the best gear. If we could just use GPS, we could plan EVERYTHING. The unknown is dark and so challenging for many of us.

Sometimes we face these feelings when we think about the need for restoration in this world. HPCA exists to help bring restoration in North Philadelphia and we are not immune to this way of thinking. When tasks gets tough, we long for a glimpse of the end result or just a bit of assurance that our path is correct. I believe Jesus' response to us is the same as it was to His apostles: "I am the way. I am preparing the end. Believe in me." He says that we will be able to do what He did (and more) because He is going to the Father.

We do have to work with strength, and smarts, and determination, but the "greater things than these" happens when we believe and ask. Believing and continuing without specific directions, explanations, or even, in many ways, a defined outcome, has never sat well with our human longing for total control and lucid foresight. Finding our way and restoring what we can has always been, ultimately, about having faith and giving away what we have been given. Even when things are hard, HPCA strives to keep our eyes on Christ, trust in His leading, and, in doing so, set an example of faith for our students. We ask that you would pray for us and partner with us in this. Sure, there is struggle in navigating the unknown. But when our perspective is based on Jesus as the Way, there is also peace-filled beauty in the mystery of it all.

Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit ...Turn Your Tax Dollars into Scholarships



The OSTC allows qualified PA businesses to fulfill their state tax burden by providing scholarships to low-income students at HPCA!

Businesses receive a tax credit of 75% (for a one-year donation commitment) or 95% (for a two-year donation commitment).

If your business is authorized to operate in PA and pays one of the following taxes, you are eligible to donate through OSTC.
