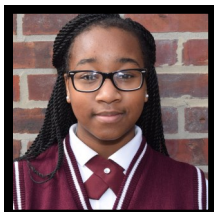




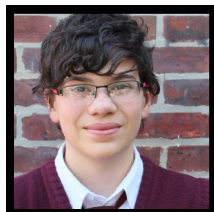
Congratulations, Graduates!

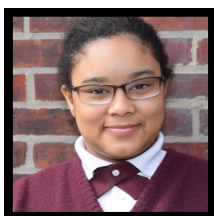
Ce'yonna

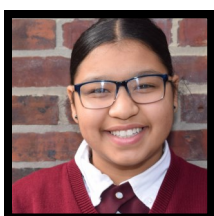
Deliasha

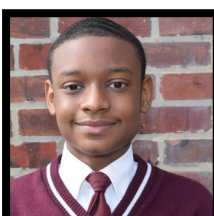
Isaac
