The team has debated various topics including protecting anonymous speech under the First Amendment and whether cyberbullying should be a crime.

The students are gaining valuable skills by being on the debate team. The team has learned that debate is about presenting differing opinions while maintaining their composure. One member stated, "I see these skills helping me in the future by allowing me to speak and argue more efficiently." Another student felt that this experience has helped her learn to work more effectively with other people.
