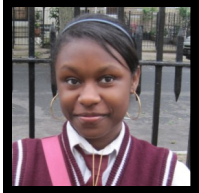


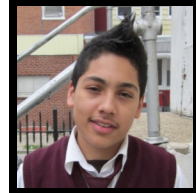
Congratulations, Graduates!

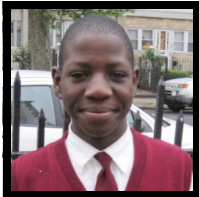
Angel

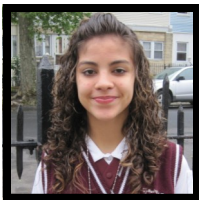
Rasheed

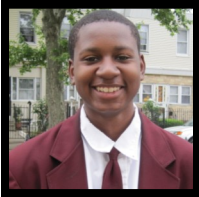
Briela

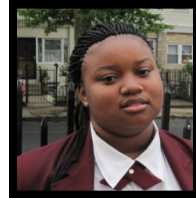
Mykaela
