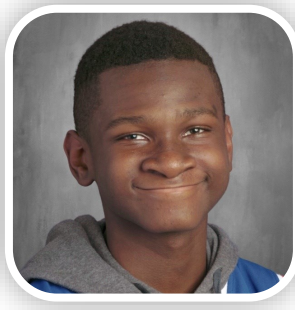
ANNALISE

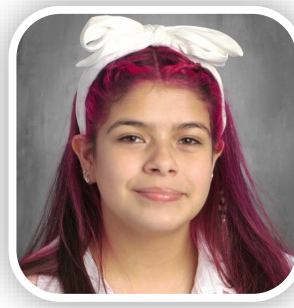
FALLON

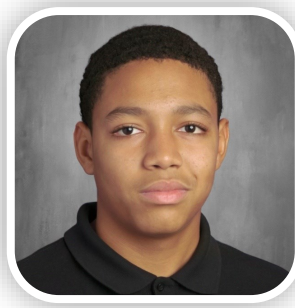
ISAAC

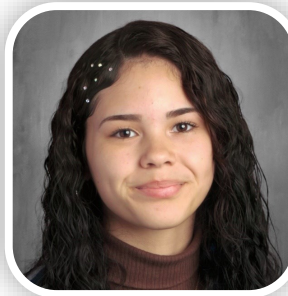
MALCOLM
