During a year of constant change, we suffered the loss of our beloved Mrs. Miriam Nesbitt, 19-year veteran, worship leader, and "mom" to hundreds of students.

Victory. Thankfully, we are all also familiar with this truth. Miriam's death impacted us deeply, but the ultimate victory that she is experiencing is part of our great hope. When we are faced with change and difficulty, whether caused by the decisionmaking of others or ourselves (or the Lord), where is the victory? What do we do?

Scripture tells us to remember. To remember the Creator and His good deeds. So, we take time to recall how He has been an ever-present help to us, a fortress in times of trouble, a faithful provider for HPCA, and how His steadfast love has carried and shaped us.

Scripture tells us to wait on Him, whether situations are calm or messy. "Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her," said Jesus when Mary chose to sit at the Lord's feet, listening to what He said. In waiting, we listen, we learn, and we "be."

## In Memory of Miriam Nesbitt




