




RISE: Respond. Ignite. Serve. Excel.

We value relationships because we belong to a God who values relationships. We are made for them. Just look at Ephesians 2, from where our monthly memory verse above is taken. The chapter is a clear and beautiful example of the Lord's desire for relationship and the lengths to which He is willing to go for it. He values relationship so much that He sacrificed His life to break down walls of separation. Look at the difference. "By birth," we are foreigners, excluded from citizenship, separate from Christ, without hope, and far away. But, "by blood," Jesus brings us near, destroys the "dividing wall of hostility," makes two groups into one new humanity, gives us access to the Father, and makes us members of the same household and fellow citizens.

God has borne the burden in order to bring us in, and we have received the magnificent benefits of true relationship. As verses 21-22 say, we get to be together within the walls of God's holy temple, and we are being built together to become the dwelling in which God lives. ## BEFORE- AND AFTER-SCHOOL

In January, HPCA began our own before- and after-school program! The program that had previously served our students had to close in December, unfortunately. Knowing that many of our families rely on these extended hours because of their work schedules, HPCA stepped in to create our own program to serve our students.

We currently have 15 students in our before-school program. Students typically do fun theme days, like "Thankful Thursday," where students write thank you notes to different students or staff members, or "Tournament Tuesday," which has featured some fierce Connect 4 battles!

The after-school program currently serves 40 students. A typical day involves a snack, homework help, independent reading, and free play. When HPCA has half days, the after-school program gets to do special activities like painting on canvases, creating cake pops and Valentine's Day cards for supporters, and creating stained glass paintings. Also, our middle-school students had a field trip to Eastern State Penitentiary.

# Why I Gave My Tax Dollars to HPCA by Dave Minno, HPCA Board Vice-President



When my wife, Susie, and I learned that we could use the income tax money we pay to the Commonwealth of PA to support the work of HPCA, our ears perked up and we listened. We found out that in 2014 through the Tax Reform Act, Pennsylvania allows the prepayment of taxes through a

"special purpose entity" for the purpose of providing quality education in private schools. This applies to anyone who has an income tax liability with the State of over \$3,500.

The process was simple. We sent a one-page joinder form with our pledged amount to Central Pennsylvania Scholarship Fund, the "special purpose entity" that HPCA uses. In October, we sent them a check in the amount of our PA taxes. In the beginning of the following year, we receive a voucher for 90% of what we sent in. This voucher is filed as a credit with our tax return to the State. 100% of the contribution goes to HPCA, with no administrative fee subtracted.

If you love the mission and work of HPCA to provide a quality, Christian education to children at risk, I would encourage you to take advantage of this simple, wonderful program. I plan to do it again next year!
