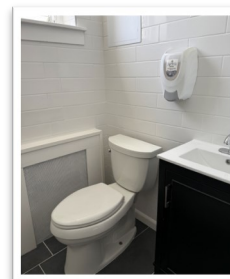

Picture it: a winter wonderland. Rolling hills, long fields, and cozy homes all blanketed in four or five feet of thick, sparkling snow. Our small town, which lies 35 miles inland from Lake Erie, had been bombarded overnight, and my school called a snow day - a rare occurrence. I was in fifth grade, and my brothers and I did what we were supposed to do. We bundled up in layer upon layer of winter garb and played in the snow for hours. We came upon one tantalizing opportunity - a steep, 10-foot drop-off leading to incredible mounds of unspoiled snow. Just perfect. I was first. I ran as fast as I could and launched myself off the edge. I soared. Then, thwump. I found myself up to my chin in snow, with no ground beneath my feet. As I tried to kick footholds to climb and escape, I sank another inch. Then another. I was scared. I decided to stop moving and wait for help.

Perhaps you feel like that sometimes, the feeling of not having solidity under your feet for one reason or another. It could be due to uncertainty, strained relationships, loss or a thousand other reasons. Finding that firm foundation in the midst of those situations can be challenging, especially when we do not have a grasp on what to do. Scripture's answer in Psalm 37 seems almost irrational: delight in Him. In the middle of struggle and with uncertain steps, how do we delight? On that day in 5th grade, I was not delighting, but we have a unique opportunity as followers of a loving God. We can simply draw near to Him. When we do, and we slow down enough to listen, we can know His heart and know the love He has for us as sons and daughters. **We can delight in Him because He first delights in us.**

**We can also delight in God by telling of His good work, and we are thankful that He is still at work in Hunting Park.** HPCA is full of committed, caring staff, showering our students and families with love. We have a new crop of students and gracious families to welcome to our school. Our after-school program is larger than ever. Also, thanks to a generous donation, we renovated six bathrooms this summer (*see right*), and they are amazing!

## DID YOU KNOW?

- The tuition at HPCA is \$8,400 per year, but no parent pays that! **The average amount per child is \$1,210!**
- 100% of our families receive a grant-in-aid that lowers payments to \$2,400 for the first child, \$1,600 for the second, and \$1,100 for every other child in the family.
- In addition to the above discounts, we offer hardship scholarships for families who need extra help and income-based scholarships to help our lower-income families.
- Parent payments only cover 20% of HPCA's total operating costs!
- This year, we need to raise \$930,000 in total contributions to keep HPCA affordable.

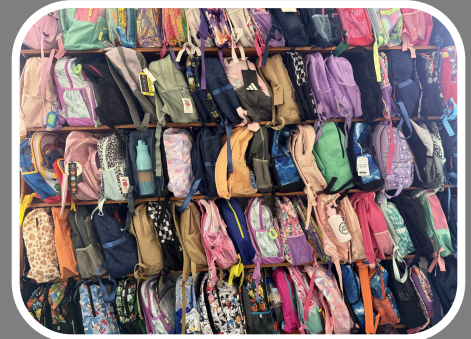


# THANK YOU, ELMC!
