- Some friends donated necessary PPE as we prepared to open.
- We had many volunteers help us by moving furniture and sanitizing.

With all of the changes and additional expenses, we anticipate needing to raise an additional \$100,000 dollars this school year. There have been many changes at HPCA this year. We are excited to share what is happening with you!

- In order to ensure proper distancing, we reopened utilizing a hybrid schedule with students in person two days a week and distance learning for three days. Families could also choose a full-time virtual schedule if that fit their needs better (see chart for breakdown of students). In-person students sit at least six feet apart, wear face shields/masks, and are separated by plastic barriers.
- Teachers have a new tech setup to make streaming their lessons through Zoom to virtual students more effective, including two webcams, a microphone, and a mobile computer cart. We hired Mrs. Lin as our virtual learning facilitator to oversee full-time virtual students, make sure they are logged in for Zoom meetings, troubleshoot tech issues, answer questions, and coordinate supply pickups. This has been a tremendous help to our teachers.
- We have been hard at work to purchase more Chromebooks for our students.
 We are close to providing a Chromebook for every student to have their own!
- There are four assigned entrances for students where they are welcomed, have their temperature taken, and get hand sanitizer before heading to class. Our middle school classes are now located across the street at Joy in the City, owned by Spirit and Truth Fellowship.
- Breakfast and lunch are also provided for students on their at-home days.
- Fridays are for building community. Chapel is streamed on YouTube and Facebook at 9 am (you can join us!). After that, classes have whole-group Zoom lessons and team-building games.
